



Maciej Marszałek is a full professor of social sciences. Currently, as a researcher and lecturer he focuses his activity on security studies at the Institute of Strategic Studies of the War Studies University in Warsaw. He is a member of the Executive Academic Board of the European Defence and Security College.

Before joining the ranks of civilian academics, he served in various military units and institutions for 35 years. His military service concerned primarily the air defence and from 1995 to 2016, he worked at the National Defence University, occupying consecutive service positions adequate to achieved academic degrees and titles, inter alia: the director of the Institute of State Security and the dean of National Security Faculty. He retired from the military service with the rank of colonel.

He focuses his scientific activity on international security, especially its military dimension, including war and armed conflicts. His key area of scientific interest is crisis management in the international dimension with the participation of NATO, the European Union and the United Nations. Much of the effort in this regard is devoted to responses to the crises in the Balkans. Marszałek's another area of scientific interest is the missile defence system, covering both the military and political dimension. He is also interested in humanitarian operations with the armed forces' engagement.

Author and co-author of many academic books and articles in the above mentioned research fields, Maciej Marszałek published inter alia: *NATO Crisis Management System as a Subject of Research under the Security Studies in Poland* (2021), *Modern Missile Defence System as an Indispensable State's and NATO's Deterrence Tool* (2021), *Future Challenges to NATO and Impact on Defence Policy of European Allies* (2018), *National and International Dimension of Crisis Management* (2014), *Crisis Management in NATO* (2013). *Military and Non-military Capabilities of the North Atlantic Treaty in Providing International Security* (2012).

He has supervised numerous PhD theses and chaired many habilitation commissions.
